## A-1b: Administrative Structure and Management Systems

#### **President (Roland Maples)**

Responsible for developing and overseeing all operations of the club. Weekly Sunday events as well as monthly tournaments are organized, managed, and modified (if necessary) by the club president. Fiscal responsibilities also fall under the purview of the club president (money in and money out to players for weekly games and annual membership dues). The club president also makes decisions to maintain the integrity of the club. This includes but is not limited to terminating player membership.

#### **Chief Operating Officer (Anthony Maples)**

Responsible for the activation of all members to the golf club. Handles all financial transactions with the NCGA, maintaining the club's active affiliation with said entity. The COO also publishes the monthly tournament results for the membership.

### Marketing Manager (Stan Williams)

The marketing manger is responsible for maintaining the club website, developing and publishing branded materials (logo & official club gear), and capturing club photographs.

#### **Technology Director (Jaseon Outlaw)**

The technology director is responsible for the recommendation and implementation of technology to make the club run more efficiently. In addition, this person assists with the weekly games, including posting messages, adding and removing players each week.

## **B-1: Policies**

### **B-1b: Dress Code**

While there are no official requirements for dress code, players should avoid jeans and attire that may be considered inappropriate by golf courses. When playing at a country club, players should avoid jeans and shorts, while wearing a collared shirt.

### B-1c: Player Systems (Back Tee Golf, Cashless Payment Systems)

a. Back Tee Golf (app.backteegolf.com) is the current system used for weekly games. The application allows members to view upcoming games, join a game, leave a game, view who is signed up for a game, and it also provides a live leaderboard for in-play golf. In addition to signing up for Backtee golf as a user, members should request to become a member of Maples Golf Club within the app. This allows members to receive important information specific to the club. The cost for the application is integrated into the weekly pot fee (\$1 per player, per round).

Since COVID-19 provided reason to limit the contact between players, the club has gone cashless. Several benefits have been recognized since the cashless system has been in place, but this provides benefits to both club administration and members. Pot money requirements and winnings are managed in this manner. The following options are provided:

Pot money for Sunday matches is due to Roland by 5pm the Friday before the Sunday match. If money is not received by the deadline, you run the risk of losing your spot to the waiting list.

#### **B-1d: United States Golf Association Rules**

Maples Golf Club complies with the current version of the United States Golf Association (USGA) rule book. Please refer to the current edition of the rule book for rules of play.

## **B-1e: Flighting and Flight Graduation Criteria**

a. For the weekly Sunday matches, players are flighted into either A or B flight, based on handicap and history. In general, A flight players play to a 7 handicap or below and B flight players play to an 8 handicap and above. Low gross pot is strongly encouraged but is optional for B flight players.

## Criteria for graduation to A flight from B flight is as follows:

Formal promotion criteria from B flight to A flight (any one of the following will result in a promotion):

- 1. Golfer shoots 75 or below in a Sunday round
- 2. Golfer wins Sunday match (B Flight) by 5 or more strokes
- 3. Golfer wins Low Gross in 3 Sunday matches in a row
- 4. Golfer wins 3 Sunday matches in a 3-month period.
- 5. Golfer self-selects into A flight in an attempt to push him/her to improve his/her game Note: A flight players are expected to have a general knowledge of the current USGA rulebook.

# C-1c: Club History & Records

Kennedy Park (Napa) and Paradise Valley (Fairfield) were early courses frequented by the club, while Rancho Canada East/West were long time Maples Golf Club battlefields. Early members to the club were Roland Maples, Greg Isom, Mike Lopez, Dennis Takahashi, Gene Thomas, Furlee Mulazim, Eddie Holiday, Mike Henry, London Pope, Bijon Hughes, Freddie Brown, and the late Bob Preston, and Art Mitchell. The Maples Golf Club is arguably one of the most competitive golf clubs in existence. The club

has been known to house "a bunch of ringers," sparking fear in many who consider competing for the first time.
